- He used colour mixing/HUES and Impasto (thick paint).
- Sgraffito (Italian for scratching into).

Key Vocabulary

Definition (Include a mix of art and music key terminology)

Line	A drawing made with lines of different textures and thickness.
Tone	Lightness and darkness of a colour.
Pattern	A repeated decoration or pattern.
Colour	The use of all the colours in painting as distinct with different lights and shade.
Sgraffito	Decoration produced (on pottery or ceramic, for example) by scratching through a surface layer to reveal a different color underneath.
Orchestra	A large group of musicians who play together on various instruments, usually including strings, woodwinds, brass instruments, and percussion instruments.
Tempo/texture	The speed at which music is to be played, music considered as of melody and rhythm and harmony.

- **Joseph Ascher** is a dutch composer from the time of 1829-1869
- An example of music - Pepita, Polka.
- He composed 170 pieces of work for piano
- **Anton Bruckner** is an Austrian composer from between 1824 -1896

Key Vocabulary

Definition (Include a mix of art and music key terminology)

Impressionism	A period of time (movement) when artists created 'impressions' of reality through artwork.
Pointillism	Using small dots of pure colour to create a full piece.
Line	A mark that goes between two points taking any form along the way.
Tone	The use of light and dark, shade and highlight.
Texture	The perceived surface quality of a piece of art. (Does it look how it would look and feel in real life?)
Pattern	Repetition of a design, shape or object.
Colour	The use of shade in art and design.
Jazz	Jazz is a type of music where improvisation is very important. Jazz players take turns to play solos which they make up on the spot.
Britpop	British music and culture movement - brighter and catchier alternative rock.


