<b>The legend of Kevin</b>	<p><b>Legend</b> – a story passed down through generations, often featuring heroic acts.</p> <p><b>Quest</b> – a long journey with a purpose, often involving challenges.</p> <p><b>Epic</b> – grand, large in scale.</p> <p><b>Heroic</b> – brave, courageous actions, typical of a hero.</p> <p><b>Keviny</b> – referring to the character Kevin in a playful way.</p> <p><b>Snuffly</b> – a fun, descriptive word to express something small, maybe with a snuffling sound.</p> <p><b>Wobble</b> – to move unsteadily, like something that shakes or falls.</p> <p><b>Flapdoodle</b> – a made-up term meaning nonsense or silly talk.</p> <p><b>Squishy</b> – something soft and squishy in texture, like a soft toy or food.</p> <p><b>Muddy</b> – something covered in mud, often used in outdoor adventures.</p> <p><b>Soggy</b> – wet and soft, typically used to describe something that's soaked through.</p> <p><b>Fluffy</b> – soft and light, often used for describing animals or clouds.</p> <p><b>Blustery</b> – describing strong, gusty winds.</p>



	<p><b>Galloping</b> – moving very fast, like a horse or a fast runner.</p> <p><b>Tumbling</b> – falling or rolling in a playful or uncontrollable way.</p> <p><b>Zooming</b> – moving quickly, often used to describe something going fast.</p> <p><b>Pouncing</b> – leaping or jumping suddenly, often like an animal catching prey.</p> <p><b>Grumpy</b> – being in a bad mood, not very happy.</p> <p><b>Wiggly</b> – moving or twisting in a small, playful way.</p> <p><b>Clumsy</b> – lacking grace, often used when someone or something falls over or bumps into things.</p> <p><b>Cheeky</b> – playful or a bit naughty, in a fun way.</p>
<p><b>Bill's New Frock</b></p>	<p><b>Frock</b> – a dress, often used for girls in the book (something that may need explaining to younger readers).</p> <p><b>Blouse</b> – a type of shirt, often worn by girls.</p> <p><b>Skirt</b> – a piece of clothing that covers the lower part of the body.</p> <p><b>Trousers</b> – pants, worn by boys in the book before Bill changes clothes.</p> <p><b>Confused</b> – not sure about something, feeling uncertain.</p> <p><b>Embarrassed</b> – feeling awkward or shy, usually because of something unusual or unexpected.</p> <p><b>Awkward</b> – feeling uncomfortable or out of place.</p> <p><b>Flustered</b> – feeling nervous or upset, often from being in a confusing situation.</p> <p><b>Horrified</b> – feeling shocked or scared, like when something surprising or upsetting happens.</p> <p><b>Nervous</b> – feeling uneasy, worried, or anxious.</p> <p><b>Miserable</b> – feeling very sad or unhappy.</p> <p><b>Girly</b> – a word that describes things typically associated with girls, often in a stereotypical way.</p> <p><b>Uncomfortable</b> – not feeling at ease; when something feels strange or out of place.</p> <p><b>Normal</b> – the usual or expected way of doing things, the opposite of something unusual or different.</p> <p><b>Pretend</b> – to act as if something is real when it's not.</p>



	<p><b>Stumble</b> – to trip or lose balance while walking.</p> <p><b>Stare</b> – to look at something for a long time, often in surprise or shock.</p> <p><b>Panic</b> – to feel very scared and react quickly, sometimes without thinking.</p> <p><b>Grumble</b> – to complain quietly, usually in frustration.</p> <p><b>Sigh</b> – to let out a long breath, often as a sign of disappointment or relief.</p> <p><b>Frustrated</b> – feeling upset because things aren't going the way you want.</p> <p><b>Self-conscious</b> – being overly aware of yourself, often feeling shy or awkward because of how others might see you.</p> <p><b>Relieved</b> – feeling better after a worry or stressful situation is over.</p> <p><b>Furious</b> – very, very angry.</p> <p><b>Magically</b> – happening in a way that feels like magic, surprising or unbelievable.</p> <p><b>Unbelievable</b> – hard to believe, something very surprising or strange.</p> <p><b>Ridiculous</b> – something that is very silly or not logical.</p> <p><b>Transform</b> – to change completely, as in the magical change Bill undergoes.</p>
