- Create a list of books that you've read so far. Can you begin to sort them into stories with similar themes, characters or plots?
- Parents: with your child, ask them to stop at a certain point in a book, ask them to recap the main parts of the story so far. Can they summarise the main parts in less than 15 words?
- Parents: before reading a new book, ask your child to predict what they think could happen in the book. Are there any clues or details in the text or title to support their predictions? After reading, discuss their predictions. How close were they?
